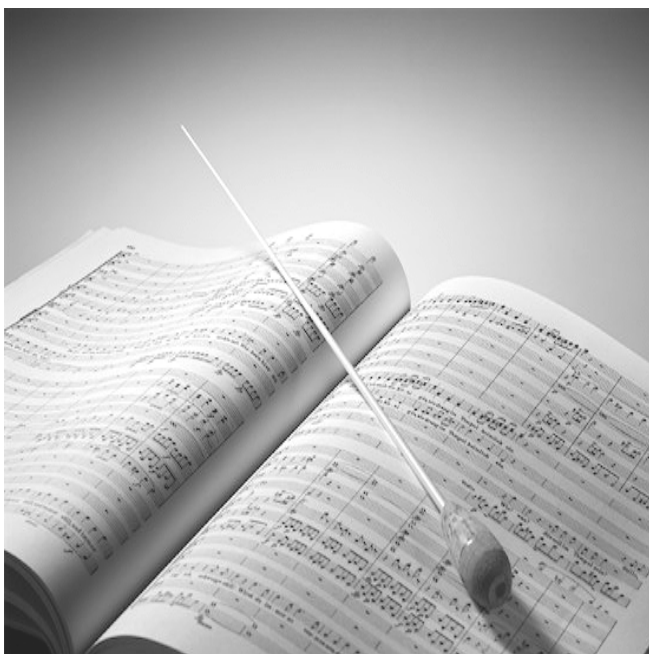

ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Carla Oliver retired in 2009 after 26 years serving as Director of Choral Activities and Music Department Chair at Lee's Summit High School. While at Lee's Summit High School, She had an enrollment of 500 students in her program. The curriculum included Concert Choir, Sounds of Summit (chamber choir), two Women's choirs, two Men's choirs, and two Freshman Women's Choirs. Music Appreciation was also taught by the choral music department. Mrs. Oliver's choirs received consistent 1 ratings at state festival and performed 7 times at Missouri Music Educators' Conference at Tan Tar A, Lake of the Ozarks. Her choirs have performed throughout the Midwest in festivals and clinics. She has served in numerous capacities for MCDA and MMEA. Some awards she has received include the Luther T. Spayde award, and Outstanding Music Educator for the state of Missouri. Today, she maintains a private vocal studio of 25 students, and is the Director of Music at Lee's Summit Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Carla is married to James Oliver, retired Director of Bands at Lee's Summit High School. Together, they share 7 children and 14 grandchildren.

Mrs. Stewart is the vocal music teacher and formerly the drama teacher at Pattonville Heights Middle School. Ms. Stewart is a National Board Certified teacher (2003) and was the Pattonville School District Middle School Teacher of the Year in 2009. ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Mrs. Humiston has recently retired after 31 years of string education. During her 26 years in the Parkway School District, she completed 12 years as the Assistant Orchestra Director for the Parkway South High School orchestras. During her tenure, the Parkway South Symphonic Orchestra was selected three times to perform at the Missouri Music Educators Conference. In addition to the high school, she was a string specialist in the elementary schools string program which begins in the third grade. Previously, Marilyn taught six years in the Ladue School District during which her Junior High String Orchestra also performed at the MMEA Conference. She is Director of the Parkway String Camp; President of the historic St. Louis Philharmonic Orchestra as well as a member of the violin section; founding member of her string quartet, The Manhasset Strings; and a free-lance musician. She was also chosen to serve as the district's String Teacher Mentor. Mrs. Humiston's service to her profession includes positions as the MMEA Orchestra Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer on the Mo-ASTA Board of Directors, Chair of the Missouri All-State Orchestra Auditions and Co-Editor of Mo-ASTA's state magazine, Soundpost. She received the Mo-ASTA Distinguished Service Award in 1997-98 and was selected the Mo-ASTA 2008 Outstanding String Music Educator of the Year. During the two terms Mrs. Humiston served as the St. Louis Suburban Elementary Instrumental Vice-President, she founded and developed the 6th Grade All-Suburban Honors Orchestra. She was the recipient of the 2001 St. Louis Suburban Music Educators Merit Award. ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Dr. Laycock has presented clinic sessions for state education conferences as well as the American String Teachers Association National Conference, the Northwest Division Convention of the Music Educators National Conference, and the Midwest Clinic. From 1998-2003, Dr. Laycock served as Director of Orchestral Activities at Iowa State University and was Music Director of the Central Iowa Symphony. Under his leadership, the ISU Symphony Orchestra performed at the North Central Division Convention of the Music Educators National Association and collaborated with such artists as bass-baritone Simon Estes and pianist-composer Marvin Hamlisch. He earned a Doctor of Arts degree in orchestral conducting from the University of Northern Colorado. Dr. Laycock holds a Master of Music degree in instrumental conducting from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and a Bachelor of Arts degree in music history and literature from the University of Southern California.
